Dear HPPC Family,

One of my favorite children's book authors is Byrd Baylor. She wrote a book called *The Table Where Rich People Sit.* In the book, the main character is named Mountain Girl. She "knows her family doesn't have enough money. But as the family sits around their scratched-up kitchen table and discusses the subject, her parents say they're *rich*. Don't her parents see her worn-out shoes or the patches on her little brother's pants?

They begin to count up the value of the things they have. How much is it worth to be able to see the sky all day and feel the wind and smell the coming rain? Or to watch a cactus bloom or to sleep outside under the stars?" (Simon & Schuster Summary) After a while, Mountain Girl begins to realize her family may be rich after all.

As we enter this stewardship season, I think it is important to come from a place of abundance. If we start with scarcity, we may trick ourselves into thinking we have nothing to give. However, when we stop, gather around the table and consider the many gifts God has bestowed upon us, we are sure to have many options when it comes to giving to Christ's ministry...giving of ourselves, our time, our talents, our labor and our money.

I have read many articles on stewardship and one perspective has stuck with me. This perspective says that stewardship is a role, giving is an act and generosity is an attitude or intention. In Biblical times, a steward was tasked with managing the finances and household affairs for their master. In more modern language, we might understand the role of steward similar to the role of manager. In order to manage the gifts we have been given and use them to God's glory, we must be diligent in taking inventory of them. We must gather at the table – whether it is the Lord's Table or our scratched-up dining room tables – and take time to account for our many, many blessings with gratitude to God.

Then, aware of our wealth from God, we must maintain generous attitudes and embark in giving. It will not look the same for each of us, but it will be exactly what Christ's ministry needs.

May it be so.

- Pies (pumpkin or pecan)




Blessings
