


All About Easter Season



Palm Sunday

Jesus rode on a donkey through Jerusalem on his way to conquer death and bring us life through His sacrifice on the cross. The ride was an announcement that he was the long-awaited king, but not in the way most expected. Rulers rode horses into battle, but the donkey symbolized peace. Jesus' mission was not one of a warrior but as a humble king bringing salvation. Palm branches are signs of victory, triumph, peace, and eternal life.



Maundy Thursday

Maundy comes from the Latin word *mandātum*, which means mandate or command. During Christ's final meal, as he washed the disciples' feet, he said, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" (John 13:34). This was a request for his disciples to show forgiveness to all. The supper consisted of bread (the body) and wine (the blood) for the salvation of humanity.



Good Friday

The term "Good" is often questioned about the suffering and death of Jesus. He gave his life that day so that we could be forgiven for our sins. Jesus knew it was going to lead to his resurrection, our salvation and God's reign of righteousness and peace. According to Peter 3:18, "For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive in the Spirit."



Easter

This day is one of the most important celebrations in our faith. Interestingly, the word "Easter" is never mentioned in the Bible, and its origins are unclear. What is unquestionable is what occurred that day. Christ rose from the grave after his crucifixion, death, and burial to redeem us from our sins. It is also a confirmation of what Jesus taught during his ministry. If not resurrected, he would have been just a teacher or prophet. Having done so was proof of his being the son of God.



May this time bring renewed hope to everyone. I hope we can reflect on how to improve ourselves and help our neighbors and those in need. I hope your hearts are filled with gratitude and renewed faith. Happy Easter!
